**THE WINTER FILM SERIES CONTINUES WITH ELIZABETH GREENE'S
"GRANDMA'S PHARMACY" FEBRUARY 9-10 AT THE DETROIT HISTORICAL
MUSEUM**

DETROIT – The Detroit Historical Society continues the winter edition of its film series with Wayne State University graduate Elizabeth Greene's "Grandma's Pharmacy," showing February 9th and 10th at 1 p.m. All shows are free with regular admission to the Museum.

"Grandma's Pharmacy" profiles Elizabeth Wize, a 91 year-old business woman and the first African-American woman to own a chain of pharmacies in Michigan. Wize, who has been in business for 60 years, still runs the business today in the Medical district. The run time for the film is 28 minutes.

Greene graduated from Wayne State University in 2003 with a Bachelor of Arts in Film and is currently pursuing her Master of Fine Arts in Film at Syracuse University, where she holds a full scholarship and a teaching fellowship.

The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (NW corner of Kirby) in Detroit's Cultural Center area, is open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. On Mondays and Tuesdays, the Museum is not open to the public but available for group tours by calling (313) 833-7979. Adult admission is \$6. Seniors (60+), college students with valid college ID, and youth ages 5-18 pay \$4. Admission for children ages four and under is free. Parking in the Museum's lot is \$3 at all times. Permanent exhibits include the famous Streets of Old Detroit, Frontiers to Factories, The Motor City and The Glancy Trains.
