HISTORIC FORT WAYNE OPEN FOR ANNUAL FLEA MARKET FUNDRAISER

Antique and bargain hunters will find collectibles, contemporary treasures and a variety of arts and crafts at the 23rd annual Detroit Historical Society Guild Flea Market, taking place Saturday, April 8th and Sunday, April 9th from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Historic Fort Wayne, located at 6325 W. Jefferson (at the foot of Livernois).

Returning by popular demand, tours of the Historic Fort Wayne complex will be offered each day. The guided tours will include the Star Fort built in the 1840s, the Commanding Officer's House, the Spanish-American War Guard House and the National Museum of the Tuskegee Airmen. Secured parking is only two dollars per vehicle, admission is free for the flea market, and the tours are priced at \$2 per person. Refreshments and baked goods will also be for sale. All of the proceeds will benefit the Detroit Historical Museums. Vendors can purchase tables for only \$30.
