**THE DETROIT HISTORICAL SOCIETY KICKS OFF ITS FALL FILM SERIES WITH
“DETROIT: REMEMBER WHEN, VOL. 1” ON OCTOBER 11 & 12**

DETROIT – The Detroit Historical Society kicks off its fall film series with “**Detroit: Remember When, Vol. 1 – Motor City Memories and Hometown Traditions**” showing **October 11 & 12 at 1 p.m.** at the **Detroit Historical Museum**. Each show is free with regular admission to the Museum.

From Briggs Stadium to Bob-lo, Black Bottom to the Boulevard, “**Detroit: Remember When**” captures the true spirit of Detroit. This documentary, produced by **Detroit Public Television**, reveals Detroit’s history, explores its musical legacy, and examines its architecture, politics, sports legends and landmarks. The film also looks back at summer days at Belle Isle, Vernor’s soda fountain, Jefferson Beach and Edgewater Park. The run time for the film is 44 minutes.

The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (NW corner of Kirby) in Detroit’s Cultural Center area, is open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. On Mondays and Tuesdays, the Museum is not open to the public but available for group tours by calling **(313) 833-7979**. Adult admission is \$6. Seniors (60+), college students with valid college ID, and youth ages 5-18 pay \$4. Admission for children ages four and under is free. Parking in the Museum’s lot is \$4 at all times. Permanent exhibits include the famous *Streets of Old Detroit*,
