The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (corner of Kirby) in Detroit's Cultural Center area, is open Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. Admission is \$6 for adults, \$4 for seniors (60+), college students with a valid college ID card and students and youth ages 5-18, and free for children ages four and under. Permanent exhibits include the famous Streets of Old Detroit, Frontiers to Factories, The Motor City, and The Glancy Trains. New exhibits include the 1920s: Detroit's Building Boom; Rallying the Home Front: Posters from WWII; New to the Collection, a showcase of recently acquired antiquities, oddities, and treasures; the Detroit Artist Showcase featuring early 20th century artist Amy Lorimer; Fabulous 5: Detroit Sports Legends; and Automotive Showplace.
