Tickets are \$25 per person and include Museum admission. Parking is available in the Museum’s lot off Kirby for four dollars. Proceeds will benefit the Detroit Historical Society.

The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (NW corner of Kirby) in Detroit’s Cultural Center area, is open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. On Mondays and Tuesdays, the Museum is not open to the public but available for group tours by calling (313) 833-7979. Adult admission is \$6. Seniors (60+), college students with valid college ID, and youth ages 5-18 pay \$4. Admission for children ages four and under is free. Parking in the Museum’s lot is \$4 at all times. Permanent exhibits include the famous *Streets of Old Detroit*, *Frontiers to Factories*, *The Motor City*, and *The Glancy Trains*. New exhibits include *VeloCity: Detroit’s Need for Speed*; *Hero or Villain? Metro Detroit’s Legacy of Leadership*; *Fabulous 5: Detroit’s Snack Food Superstars*; *Detroit Trivia*; and *Automotive Showplace*, spotlighting the 1963 Ford Cougar II concept car.
