**HEAR STORIES OF HEROISM AND TRAGEDY DURING A SPECIAL SCREENING
OF "MICHIGAN VOICES OF THE WAR" SATURDAY & SUNDAY,
NOVEMBER 14 & 15 AT THE DETROIT HISTORICAL MUSEUM**

DETROIT - The Detroit Historical Society continues its monthly film series with "**Michigan Voices of the War**" showing **Saturday and Sunday, November 14 & 15 at 1 p.m.** at the **Detroit Historical Museum**. Each screening is free with regular admission to the Museum.

"Michigan Voices of the War," directed and produced by **Ed Moore**, was filmed in 2007 for **Detroit Public Television**. The film features historic photographs and interviews with six World War II veterans from Michigan. These individuals -- including **Lieutenant Alexander Jefferson**, the Tuskegee Airmen who became a POW, and **Hubert Ward**, the submarine crewman who helped save the life of future president George H. W. Bush -- will share their stories of war, heroism, tragedy and humor. The run time for the film is 27 minutes.

The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (NW corner of Kirby) in Detroit's Cultural Center area, is open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. On Mondays and Tuesdays, the Museum is not open to the public but available for group tours by calling **(313) 833-7979**. Adult admission is \$6. Seniors (60+), college students with valid college ID, and youth ages 5-18 pay \$4. **On Sundays during the month of November, all seniors get in free.** Admission for children ages four and under is free. Parking in the Museum's lot is \$4 at all times. Permanent exhibits include the famous *Streets of Old Detroit*; *Frontiers to Factories*; *The Motor City*; and *The Glancy Trains*.
