**THE DETROIT HISTORICAL SOCIETY CONTINUES ITS WINTER FILM SERIES
WITH A HISTORY OF THE GROSSE POINTES -- "RECOLLECTIONS OF THE PAST:
1650-1900" -- ON JANUARY 10 & 11 AT THE DETROIT HISTORICAL MUSEUM**

DETROIT – The Detroit Historical Society continues its monthly film series with “**Recollections of the Past: 1650-1900**,” showing **Saturday and Sunday, January 10 & 11 at 1 p.m.** at the Detroit Historical Museum. Each screening is free with regular admission to the Museum.

This documentary chronicles the **Grosse Pointe** community from its beginnings as a wilderness visited by Native Americans and a quiet farming village to its development as an exclusive summer resort. The film, narrated by **Joe Weaver** and produced by **Kimberly Conley**, features antique photographs, 19th century illustrations, memorabilia, anecdotes of the time and live action sequences. The run time for the film is 28 minutes.

The Detroit Historical Museum, located at 5401 Woodward Ave. (NW corner of Kirby) in Detroit’s Cultural Center area, is open to the public Wednesday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from Noon to 5 p.m. On Mondays and Tuesdays, the Museum is not open to the public but available for group tours by calling **(313) 833-7979**. Adult admission is \$6. Seniors (60+), college students with valid college ID, and youth ages 5-18 pay \$4. Admission for children ages four and under is free. Parking in the Museum’s lot is \$4 at all times. Permanent exhibits include the famous *Streets of Old Detroit*, *Frontiers to Factories*, *The Motor City*, and *The Glancy Trains*.
