BRING DAD TO THE DETROIT HISTORICAL MUSEUM THIS WEEKEND

DETROIT – Are you having trouble planning a special Father’s Day? Want to give him a gift that would make Father’s Day memorable?

Well, spend a day with your dad, making your own history at the Detroit Historical Museum. He will love walking down the *Streets of Old Detroit*, enjoy seeing the 1963 Ford Mustang II concept car in the *America’s Motor City* exhibit, and relive fond memories seeing the old Tiger Stadium sign in the *Allesee Gallery of Culture*. You and your father will also have one last chance to explore the exceptionally colorful exhibit featuring Ukrainian Easter eggs, known as pysanky, before it closes this Sunday.

An exhibit in the Museum’s Community Gallery, *A Cultural Thread...The Enduring Ukrainian Spirit* exhibit brings to life the history of Ukrainian immigration to the United States and its impact on American culture, in particular to the communities of the metro Detroit area. The exhibit, which runs through June 16, features a variety of traditional art that Ukrainian immigrants brought to America, including over 1,000 examples of the pysanky eggs.
