ENJOY TWO FREE FILMS NOVEMBER 7 AND 8 AT THE DETROIT HISTORICAL MUSEUM AND THE DOSSIN GREAT LAKES MUSEUM

DETROIT- The Detroit Historical Society's Fall Film Series returns next weekend with two free features. Catch "**Brothers on the Line**" on **Saturday, November 7** and **Sunday, November 8** at **3 p.m.** at the Detroit Historical Museum. "**Safe Ashore**" will be screened on **Saturday, November 7** and **Sunday, November 8** at **2 p.m.** at the Dossin Great Lakes Museum. Admission for both films is free!

More about the films:

- "**Brothers on the Line**": Directed by Victor Reuther's grandson Sasha, and featuring evocative archival footage, a pulsating soundtrack, as well as first-hand accounts from labor, management, and political personalities - including one of the last interviews with Senator Ted Kennedy, "Brothers on the Line" is an award-winning documentary exploring the journey of the Reuther brothers - prolific union organizers who led an army of laborers into an epic struggle for social justice.
- "**Safe Ashore**": Featuring eyewitness accounts and exclusive footage, this film tells the story of three fishermen who race out to save a stranded crew, sailing into the aftermath of Lake Michigan's worst storm - on Armistice Day 1940. They not only rescue 17 lives, but find another ship lost with all hands.

The Society's Film Series features free monthly screenings of fascinating Detroit films at the Detroit Historical Museum and the Dossin Great Lakes Museum. Upcoming films include:

- **December 12 and December 13:** Two Gary Glaser films will be showcase this weekend! "The Hudson's Building" at the Detroit Historical Museum and "Borderline: The Story of 8 Mile Road" at the Dossin Great Lakes Museum.

The **Dossin Great Lakes Museum** is located at 100 Strand Drive on Belle Isle. Admission is free for all, all the time. Permanent exhibits include *Built by the River* in the John A. and Marlene L. Boll Foundation Gallery, the *Miss Pepsi* vintage 1950s championship hydroplane, the Gothic Room from the *City of Detroit III* in the Polk Family Hall, a bow anchor from the S.S. *Edmund Fitzgerald*, the pilothouse from the Great Lakes freighter S.S. *William Clay Ford* in the Wayne and Joan Webber Foundation Gallery, and one of the largest known collections of scale model ships in the world.
